International Yoga Day Celebrations 2021

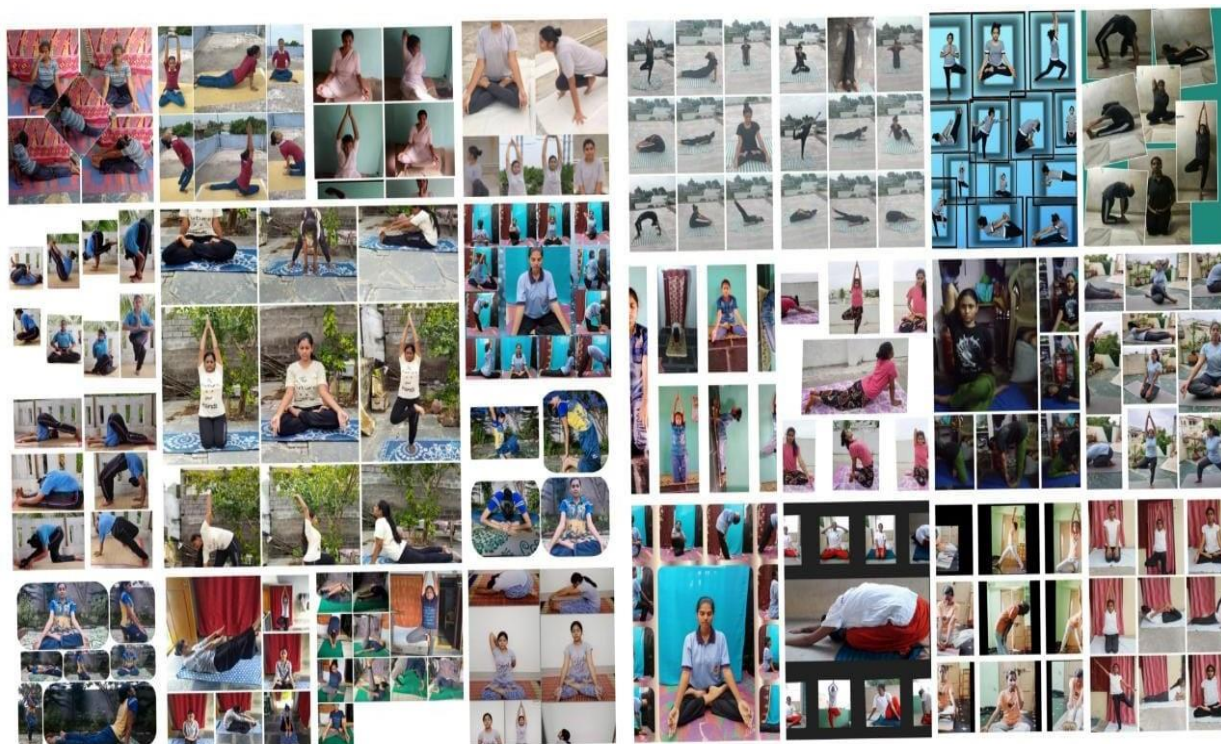
Objective: To perform Yoga asanas on the International Yoga Day at Home with Family.

Outcome: Enabled them the importance of immunity and healthy living to keep physically, mentally and spiritually fit.



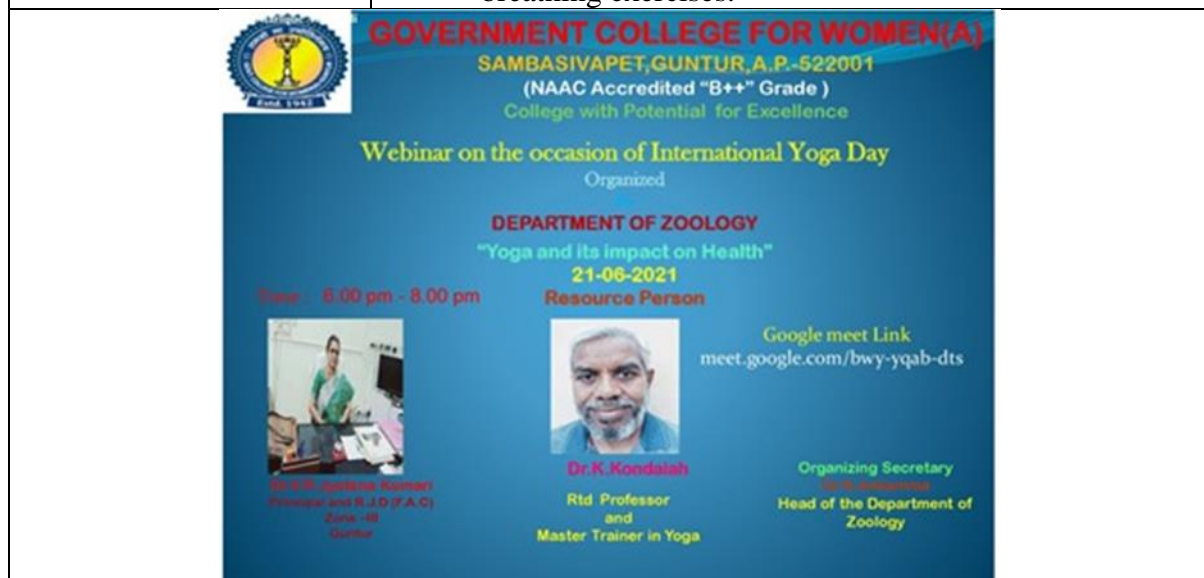

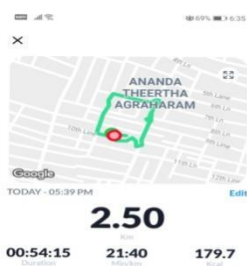
Objectives: To create awareness of being fit and making India fit.

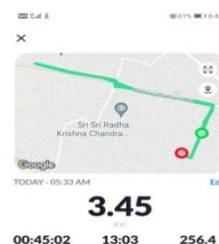

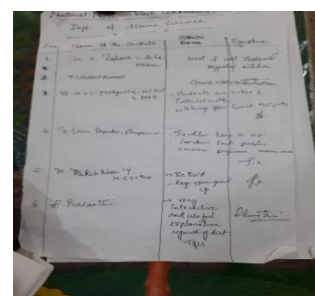

Description in brief:	<p>World AIDS Day is celebrated on December 1 every year since 1988. It is dedicated to raise awareness, educate and improve the understanding of HIV as a global public health problem. It provides an opportunity to understand the interdependence between progress in acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) and progress towards Universal Health Coverage and the right to health.</p> <p>The theme for World AIDS Day 2021 is “End inequalities. End AIDS. End Pandemics”.</p> <p>The day focuses on the increasing inequalities & inequities in access to the healthcare services for HIV due to Covid-19. This is a call for all to reach the people who are currently not receiving the AIDS related services to make lives of people living with HIV less challenging.</p> <p>According to WHO, in 2020,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 37.7 million people living with HIV have been reported in 2020• HIV caused around 1 million deaths, globally• 1.5 million new cases were detected in 2020 <p>The new target set by UNAIDS, 95-95-95, will need to redouble efforts to decrease the numbers of HIV infections due to healthcare disruptions and to increase the public health response to HIV.</p> <p>What is HIV/AIDS</p> <p>Infection caused by the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) in the human</p>

body results into weakening of people's immune system (defense system) against infections and some types of cancer. This immunodeficiency results in increased susceptibility to a wide range of infections, cancers and other diseases that people with healthy immune systems can fight off.

The most advanced stage of HIV infection is called as acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS). It is defined by the occurrence of any of more than 20 opportunistic infections or HIV-related cancers.

Signs and symptoms:

- The symptoms of HIV vary depending on the stage of infection. The first few weeks after initial infection, individuals may experience no symptoms or an influenza-like illness including fever, headache, rash, or sore throat.
- As the infection progresses, an individual can develop other signs and symptoms, such as swollen lymph nodes, weight loss, fever, diarrhoea and cough.
- Without treatment, they could develop severe illnesses such as tuberculosis, meningitis, severe bacterial infections and cancers.

How is HIV transmitted

- **Sexual Contact:** The most frequent mode of transmission of HIV is through sexual contact with an infected person.
- **Sharing needles or syringes:** HIV can be transmitted through needles and syringes contaminated with HIV infected blood.
- **Receiving blood transfusions,** blood products, or organ/tissue transplants that are contaminated with HIV can result into HIV infection.
- **From mother to child:** A pregnant woman infected with HIV can transmit the virus to child during pregnancy, birth, or breastfeeding.

High Risk groups (HRGs)- Female sex workers (FSW), men who have sex with men (MSM), transgender (TG) and injecting drug users (IDUs) belong to high-risk groups.

Bridge Populations- Individuals who have sexual partners in the high-risk groups as well as other partners of lower risk (general population) are called a "bridge population" because they form a transmission bridge from the HRGs to the

general population. Truckers and Migrant workers are named as bridge population due to their close proximity with high-risk groups and are at the risk of contracting HIV.

HIV is not transmitted:

- By hugging, shaking hands, sharing toilets, sharing dishes, or closed-mouth or “social” kissing with someone who is HIV-positive.
- By mosquitoes, ticks or other blood-sucking insects.

Prevention and control of HIV/AIDS:

National Aids Control Programme (NACP) is a 100% centrally sponsored scheme by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. The programme is being implemented through the State AIDS Control Societies (SACS) and District AIDS Prevention and Control Units (DAPCUs) in the country to reduce new infections by 50% (2007 Baseline of NACP III) and to provide comprehensive care, support and treatment to all persons living with HIV/AIDS.

Even though the prevalence of HIV is decreasing over the last decade, following activities under the NACP would provide essential support in arresting new infections and thereby achieving the target of "Ending the epidemic by 2030" for Sustainable Development Goals.

- Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Acquired Immune Deficiency Disease (AIDS) Prevention and Control Bill to ensure equal rights to the people infected with HIV and AIDS in getting treatment and prevent discrimination of any kind.
- ‘Test and Treat Policy’ for HIV with the objective of “as soon as a person is tested and found to be positive, he will be provided with ART irrespective of his CD count or clinical stage.”
- The life-saving third- line ART treatment for HIV patients free of cost
- 95-95-95 by 2024: To identify 95% of people living with HIV, place 95% of people identified as living with HIV on treatment and ensure that 95% of people on treatment have sustained viral load suppression by 2024.

Red Ribbon Express- It travels across the country through a specified route

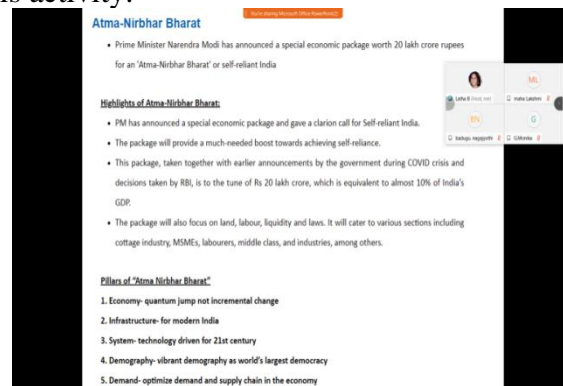
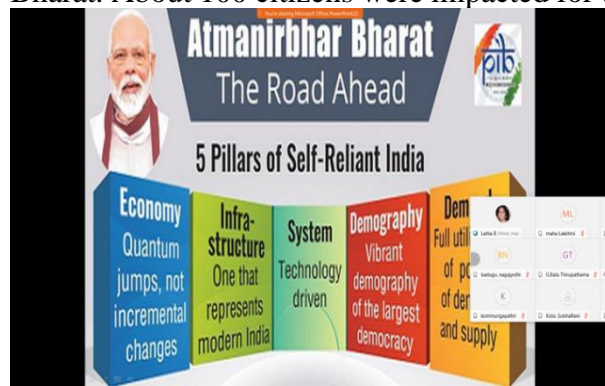
Activity- Atma Nirbar Bharat Webinar

webinar to give awareness to the students and faculty through out the Nation especially during the month of National Nutrition Month – September 2020.

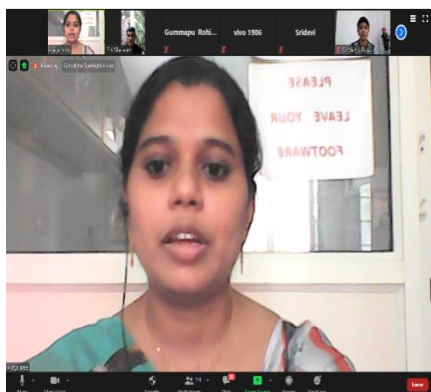

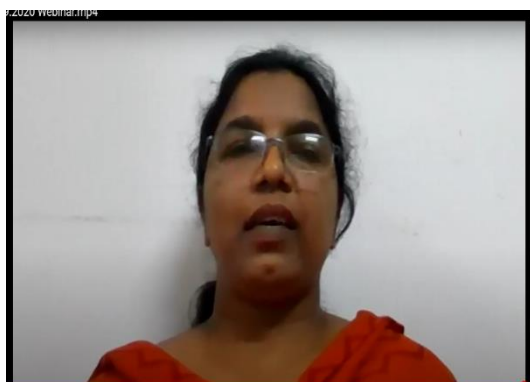

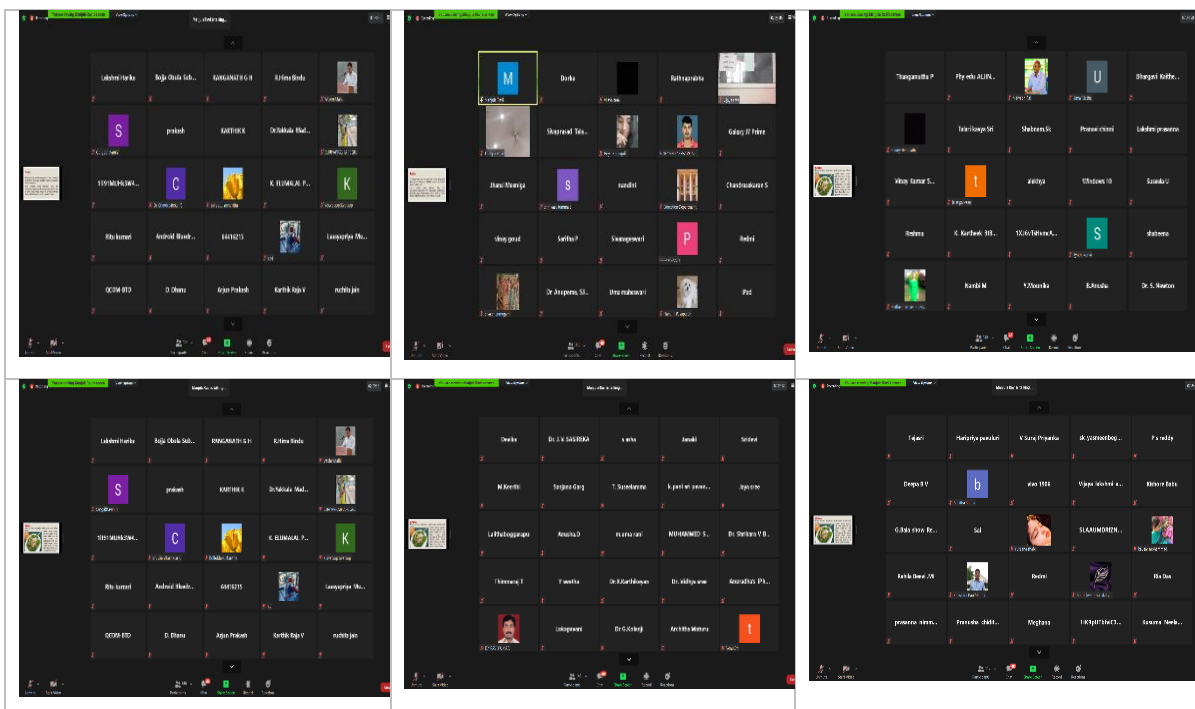

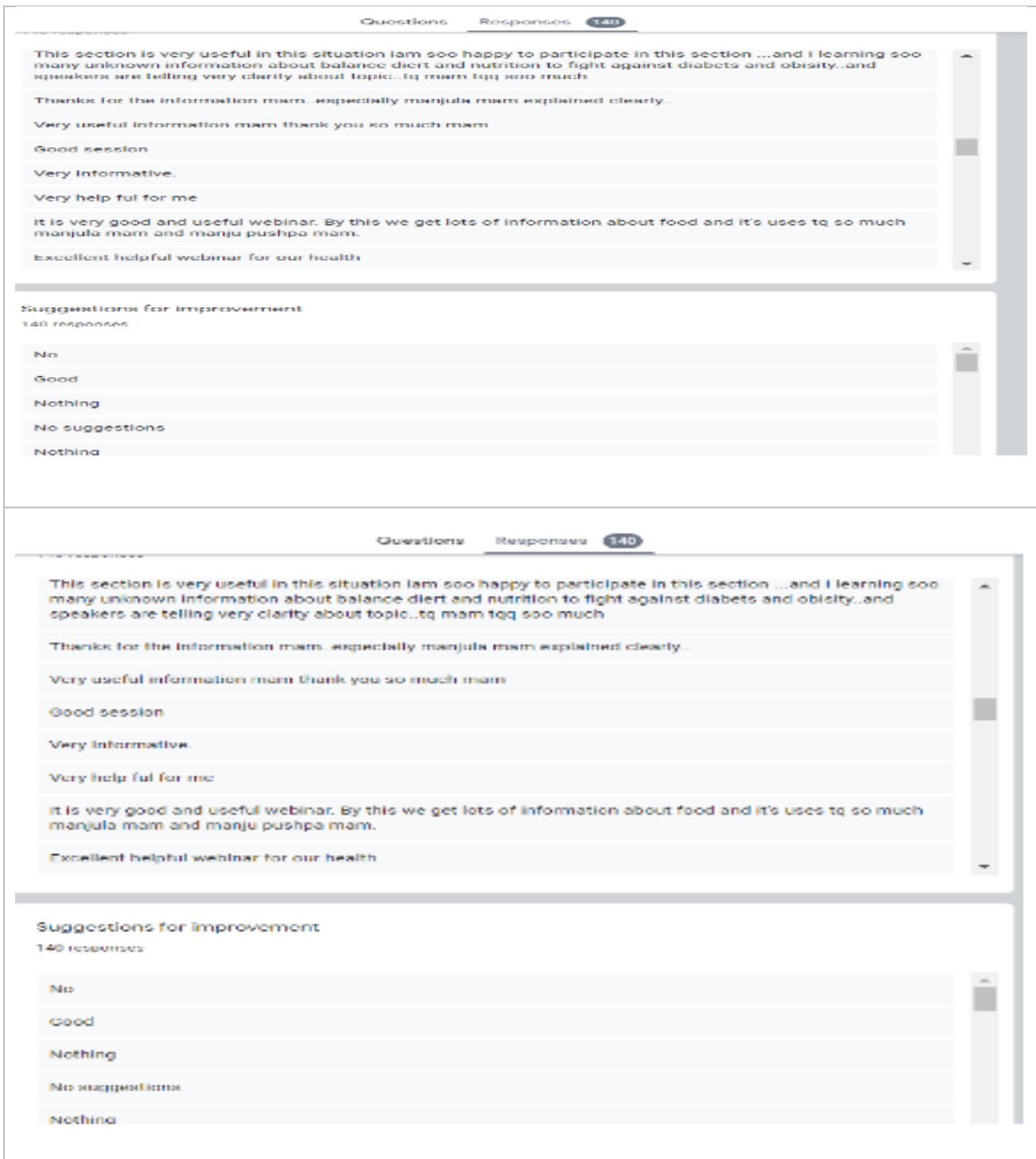

Introduction: On the occasion of National Cancer Awareness Day, Department of Biochemistry, Government College for Women(Autonomous), Guntur, organized the presentations by biochemistry students to give awareness to their classmates. The presentations were held by Google meet. Four students presented on the causes, risk factors, prevention and treatment of various types of cancer.

Objective: To provide awareness on the cancer, the department chose the 'National Cancer Awareness Day' as the platform. Hence, the department suggested few students to give presentations so that other students and families would get awareness on cancer.

November 7th was considered as a **National cancer awareness Day in India to educate people about cancer, its treatment, and its symptoms.** According to the World Health Organization (WHO), cancer is the second leading cause of death globally. In 2018, there are around 0.8 million cancer deaths in India against 9.5 million globally. By 2040, the number of new cases is estimated to be double in India.

Details: **National cancer awareness Day** is observed annually on November 7th to raise national awareness of the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of cancer and various types. It was launched by the

Union Health Minister Dr. Harsh Vardhan in September 2014. Therefore in 2014, the day was celebrated for the first time and focuses on the early detection and cure of cancer.

According to the Lancet report about cancer, India is the second biggest killer after heart disease. India is likely to have over 17.3 lakh new cases of cancer and over 8.8 lakh deaths due to the disease by 2020 with cancers of breast, lung, and cervix topping the list

The faculty of the department encouraged the presenters for preparing and delivering the presentation, so as it'll help the students to understand the severity of the condition all facing. As it was not gender, race biased etc; all have to gain the knowledge regarding it and have to take necessary precautions to avoid as a family and friends. 'P. Sravani, Suma Swarajya Lakshmi, Venusri of third BSc and Swaroopa of second BSc' gave the presentations and focused on the content.

The theme for this year was '*I Can, We Can*', based on the theme all the presenters focused on various types of cancer that were common in India. P. Sravani focused on Leukemia, Suma swarajya Lakshmi on Lymphoma, Venusri and Swaroopa on breast cancer. All focused at the national level

Symptoms of Cancer

It has been seen that usually, cancer has no specific symptoms. Therefore, people should undergo appropriate cancer screening on time. Also, early detection of cancer has made several cancers treatable.

Symptoms of common cancer in general are:

Habits of bowel changed, for example, continuous diarrhoea, Consistent cough or blood in saliva represents simple infections like bronchitis, Unexplained anaemia (low blood count) may also result in the deadly disease, Breast lumps, Urination change, Lumps in testicles, Blood in the stool.

Various types of cancer treatment

Immunotherapy, Chemotherapy, Radiation Therapy, Hormone Therapy, Targeted Therapy, Stem Cell Transplant, Surgery, Precision Medicine etc.

How can be cancer prevented?

Early detection and prevention is must to cure Cancer disease.

Healthy weight, Healthy diet, Physically active, Get vaccinated, Sun Protection, Don't use tobacco, Regular check-ups etc.

Therefore, National Cancer Awareness Day highlights the cancer disease across the country to reduce the risk of cancer and to provide knowledge on how to tackle this disease and what are the probable symptoms

that should not be neglected. **World Cancer Day** is also celebrated on 4 February annually to raise awareness about cancer globally.

As per the current scenario the presentations were done online by google meet platform. Second and third year students of biochemistry were the target audience.

TYPES OF LUKEMIA

- The four most common types of leukemia are acute lymphocytic leukemia, chronic lymphocytic leukemia, **acute myeloid leukemia**, and **chronic myeloid leukemia**.
- Acute lymphocytic leukemia (ALL, also known as acute lymphoblastic leukemia)** is the most common type of leukemia in children, but it can also affect adults. In this type of leukemia, immature lymphoid cells grow rapidly in the blood. It affects almost 6,000 people per year in the U.S.
- Acute myeloid leukemia (AML, also called acute myelogenous leukemia)** involves the rapid growth of myeloid cells. It occurs in both adults and children and affects about 19,500 people each year in the U.S.

Stem Cell Transplantation Process:

- Mobilise stem cells using growth factor and chemotherapy
- Stem cells collected from peripheral blood
- Stem cells frozen until required
- Conditioning chemotherapy to suppress immune system
- Stem cells thawed and re-infused
- Support with blood products and antibiotics (approximately 2 weeks)
- Further follow-up as outpatient for 2-3 months with regular blood tests and medication

BREAST CANCER KILLS MEN, TOO.

Risk factors for male breast cancer:

- Testicular abnormalities: cryptorchidism, orchiopexy, orchitis, testicular trauma
- Hormonal alterations: obesity, diabetes, prostate, obesity, cirrhosis and heavy alcohol intake
- Family history of breast cancer, including in BRCA1/2, CHEK2, PTEN
- Diagnosis-related factors: Klinefelter syndrome, breast cancer, breast trauma
- Exposure to radiation or high temperatures
- Older age
- Smoking history

Additional statistics:

- Less than 1% of all new breast cancer cases occur in men.
- Men with a BRCA1 mutation have a 1% risk of developing breast cancer by age 70; BRCA2 mutations confer a 6% risk.
- Breast cancer prognosis, even in stage I cases, is worse in men than in women.
- Treatment for male breast cancer has usually been a mystery, which may be followed by radiation, hormone therapy (such as with tamoxifen), or chemotherapy.

Outcome:

The presenters and students have gained some knowledge on the content are now willing to give awareness to their family and friends so that for every disease 'prevention is better than cure.' Giving a topic for presentation made students to develop vocabulary, presentation skills & communicative skills too.





Brief Report

Introduction

According to International Diabetes Federation (IDF), 463 million adults (1-in-11) are living with diabetes across the globe based on 2019 statistics and it is expected rise to 578 million by 2030. Coming to India, 72.9 million adults are suffering with diabetes and becomes the world diabetic capital next to china. So creating awareness about the disease is imperative. With this intention, **World Diabetes Day (WDD)** was created in 1991 by IDF and the World Health Organization in response to growing concerns about the escalating health threat posed by diabetes. World Diabetes Day became an official United Nations Day in 2006 with the passage of United Nation Resolution 61/225. It is marked every year on **14 November**, the birthday of Sir Frederick Banting, who co-discovered insulin along with Charles Best in 1922. Every year, the World Diabetes Day campaign focuses on a dedicated theme that runs for one or more years. The theme for World Diabetes Day 2020 is **The Nurse and Diabetes**.

Purpose

Despite the high incidence of diabetes within country, people's knowledge about the disease is minimal, especially the rural population. Most (47%) of the Indians living with diabetes is unaware of their condition. More alarming issue is the gap between urban and rural people also narrowing down year by year. This unawareness about the disease impairs the quality of life of the people suffering with diabetes leading to poor glycemic control and multiple complications. So for better control of the disease effective self-management of the individual is imperative, which requires not only medication but also active patient knowledge about the disease through education. Here comes the role of para professionals like nurses and extension agents who have strong linkage with gross root level functionaries like anganwadi teachers, workers and beneficiaries especially vulnerable groups like women and children. So in this context, the department of Home science organized a **webinar on Diabetes Education for Middle level Extension Functionaries** to create awareness about the disease to the extension professional they in turn help to train their cliental.

Objectives

- To create awareness about diabetes in general like different types of diabetes, symptoms and their riskfactors.
- To acquaint with various diagnosed tests & preventivemeasures
- To familiarize with gestational diabetes and dietarymanagement
- To raise awareness about the wise choices of foods to be taken and avoided/nutritional recommendations.
- To provide conducive environment for the patient by enhancing the family supportsystem

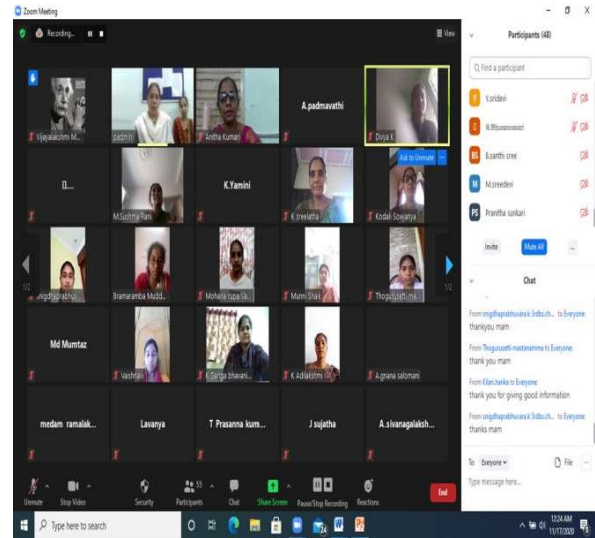
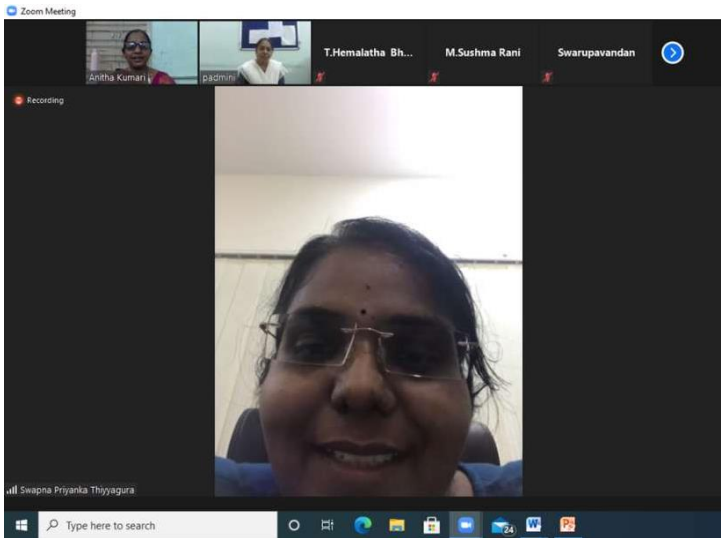
Process

The Department of Homescience organized a webinar exclusively for middle level extension functionaries such as extension supervisors, child development project officers of Women and Child Development Agency of Guntur District on **17-11-2020** on the occasion of World Diabetes day. The first session is on a glimpse of diabetes where the speaker (General Physician and Diabetologist) enlightened on various aspects related to the disease such as onset of diabetes, types, causes, symptoms, diagnostic procedures and medication. Next speaker (Dietician) concentrated on gestational diabetes management as the beneficiaries of women and child development agency are women especially pregnant and lactating mothers. Last session was on Guidelines for Preliminary Training to Family Care givers where the speaker (Lalitha Nursing College) emphasized the importance of family members support needed for Successful management of the disease. A total number of 85 participants were participated in the webinar.

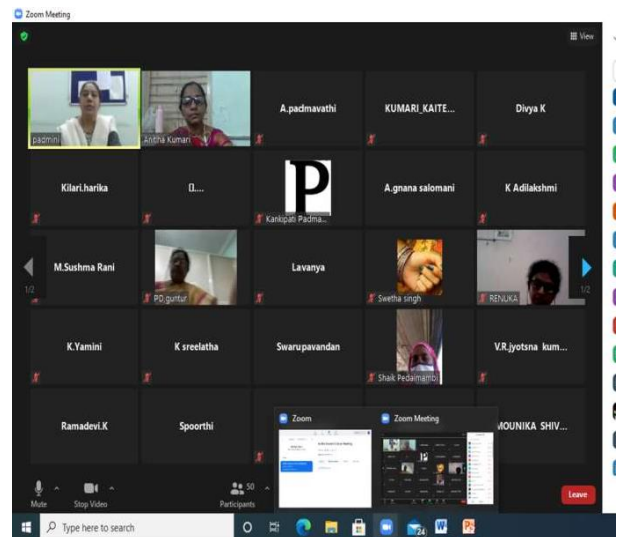

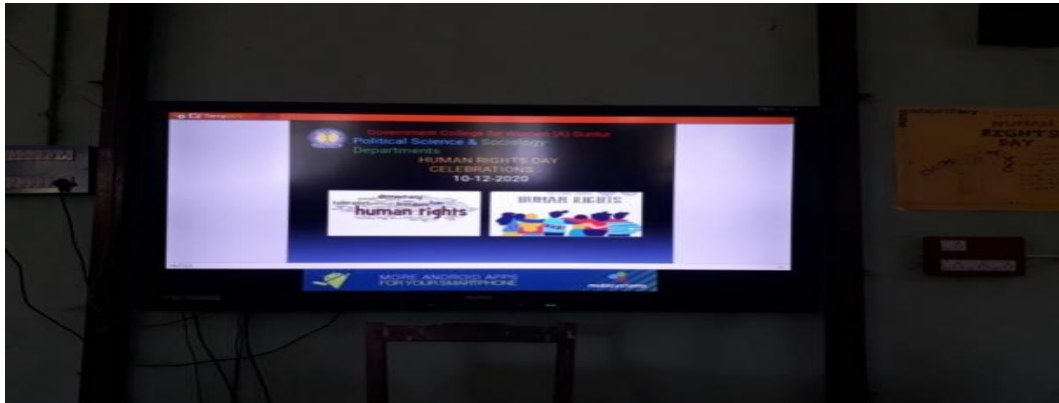
Programme Description:
