Machilipatnam is known for its Kalamkari textiles and paintings created using vegetable dyes. As a kalam (pen) was used in the technique of painting, it was called "Kalamkari Painting".

Masulipatnam is situated on the bank of river Krishna. It was founded in the fourteenth century. It was a port town. It was also called Machilipatnam because the gateway to the town was decorated with the eyes of a fish (Machili).

Masulipatnam was a production centre of the fine chintz, which was in much demand in the markets of South-east Asia.

The students showed a lot of interest in the history and techniques of kalamkari painting. It was an exciting and learning experience for the students. The trip provided the students an opportunity to know about an art which has survived the onslaught of modern textile manufacturing in their back yard. They felt proud as they came to know that they were the inheritors of a wonderful art form.
