#### **Objectives**

- To educate SHG women on sustainable practices for waste management, including wealth creation from waste, waste segregation, and home composting.
- To promote organic composting and home gardening for environmental conservation and self-sustenance.
- To provide practical skills in creating nutrition gardens using compost produced from organic kitchen waste.

### **Brief Description of the Activity**

The Eco Club of Government College for Women, Guntur, in association with ITC MSK FINISH Society, organized a two-day workshop on 7th and 8th November 2023. The workshop focused on educating two different groups of Self-Help Group (SHG) women (50 participants each day) on creating wealth from waste, proper waste segregation, and home composting techniques. This initiative aimed to promote sustainable waste management

practices and community empowerment among participants. NSS volunteers supplied water and snacks to the participants

### Day 1 and Day 2 Highlights:

On both days, Eco Club members assisted in registering participants, and NSS volunteers provided support throughout the sessions. Resource persons, including Eco Club Coordinator Smt. M. Santosh Kumari and staff from ITC MSK FINISH Society, covered various sustainable practices. Key topics included:

- **-Wealth from Waste:** Participants learned ways to repurpose household waste, upcycle materials, and reduce dependency on non-biodegradable products.
- -Waste Segregation at Source: Emphasis was placed on separating biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste at home.
- **-Home Composting** Participants received hands-on guidance on converting kitchen waste into organic compost, focusing on proper composting methods and troubleshooting.

The second day also featured additional sessions on creating nutrition gardens with organic compost, using materials distributed to reinforce the topics covered.

**Booklet and Poster Release:** Educational booklets and posters were distributed to all participants, offering practical guidelines for ongoing awareness in their communities.

### Compost Sales and Stalls for organic seeds and saplings:

The Eco Club displayed packets of organic compost from the college hostel kitchen waste to participants fpr sale and sold them at Rs. 20 /- per packet. Compost packets were also available for college staff and students. Additionally, the Departments of Botany and Horticulture installed stalls for selling organic vegetable seeds and saplings, generating Rs.3000 in income.

#### **Outcomes**

- Awareness Creation: Participants gained knowledge in waste segregation, composting, and repurposing waste materials into valuable items.

Promotion of Organic Composting: Distribution of organic compost promoted eco-friendly waste disposal methods.

Encouragement of Nutrition Gardens: Demonstrations on nutrition gardens inspired participants to grow their own food, improving health and self-sufficiency.

**Income Generation**: The sale of compost and organic seeds/saplings contributed to college efforts in promoting sustainable practices.

Community Empowerment: Educating SHG women in sustainable practices empowered them to champion waste management and environmental conservation within their communities.


#### **Conclusion**














**COMPOST PACKING** 






ORGANIC COMPOST FROM KITCHEN WASTE PACKS FOR SALE




SALE OF SEEDLINGS & SAPLINGS


