- 100% of the faculty are agreed that the curriculum has been updated from time to

time.

- 98% of the faculty are satisfied that the student centered learning resources are available in the Institution.
- 100% of the faculty are agreed that they have a chance to update their knowledge and skills.
- 98% of the faculty satisfied that the administration monitors and encourages the student centered class work and preparation of teaching resources.
- 93% of the faculty are satisfied that the ambience and working hours of the Library are motivating.
