6. Alumni-Led Awareness Programme on Workplace Safety

Event Overview: The session, spearheaded by Advocate Ms. Padmaja, an esteemed alumna of the institution, was dedicated to educating attendees about the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 in India.

Speaker's Contributions: Ms. Padmaja, leveraging her alumni status and legal expertise, provided a comprehensive overview of the Act's provisions. She underscored its critical role in protecting women at work and the mandatory responsibilities it places on employers to establish preventive and redressal measures.

Challenges Highlighted: Despite the Act's clear directives, Ms. Padmaja pointed out the concerning levels of non-compliance among Indian employers. She referenced data from authoritative sources like the International Labour Organization and FICCI-EY to illustrate this issue.

Call to Action: Emphasizing the increasing incidents of workplace sexual harassment, Ms. Padmaja called for organizations to formulate clear policies, establish prevention systems, and conduct employee training. She also shared emergency helpline numbers, stressing the necessity of immediate assistance and protection for victims.

Programme Goals: The primary aim was to enhance awareness of the Sexual Harassment Act, motivate employers towards adherence, and foster a safer work environment by advocating for preventive strategies and efficient grievance redressal mechanisms, particularly for college students entering the workforce.
