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Activity 1: World Oceans Day

Activity 3: Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC)-V


Objectives: To equip the cadets with the drill, arm drill, leadership skills required to appear for the certificate exams




Activity 7: Each One Teach One on The Occasion of Teachers Day




Activity 12: Annual Training Camp (ATC)-II



Activity 14: Inter Group competition (IGC)-Republic Day Selection Camp-2023-2024


Objectives: To send the selected cadets for attending Inter Group competition (IGC)-RDC-2023-2024 as per Battalion calendar.




Activity 21: Republic Day Contingent at GCW
